Common Exception Words/ HFW	 To read Y1 common exception words daily (in phonics), noting unusual correspondences between spelling and sound and where these occur in words.
Fluency	 To accurately read texts that are consistent with their developing phonic knowledge, that does not require them to use other strategies to work out words. To reread texts to build up fluency and confidence in word reading.
	Comprehension - Objectives (Reading Dogs)
Understanding and correcting inaccuracies	 To check that a text they read and to self- correct. To draw on what they already know or on background information and vocabulary provided by the teacher. To explain clearly their understanding of what is read to them.
Connecting and becoming familiar with texts	 To become very familiar with key stories, fairy stories and traditional tales, retelling them and considering their particular characteristics. To recognise and join in with predictable phrases participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say
Non Fiction	To discuss features and layout.
Poetry and Performance	To learn to appreciate rhymes and poems, and to recite some by heart.
Vocabulary	 To discuss word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known.
Inference	 To discuss the significance of the title and events making inferences on the basis of what is being said and done. To develop inference through use of pictures.
Prediction	 To predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far.
Retrieval	To develop their knowledge of retrieval through images.
Sequence	 To retell familiar stories orally. To sequence the events of a story they are familiar with
